Fairways Marine

To many yachtsmen the world over the Fairways Marine Range of Yachts are totally synonymous with Family Cruising. In every way the craft depicted in these pages meet the requirements of a widely varying but very discerning public – We think it is worth finding out why.

In today's developing world one of the disadvantages of increased efficiency is the monotony in the appearance of many production boats.

Looks are always a matter of personal taste of course, but the Fishers with their indefinable air of rightness and suitability of purpose always stand out in a crowd, qualities which elude so many other designers and builders.

How has this come about?

Fairways Marine was founded in 1969 by David Skellon, an airline Pilot and ex professional Yacht Skipper. Backed by his earlier deep sea sailing experience, and pilot's sense of technical perfection, the Company set out to create and promote a specifically designed cruising vessel of moulded G.R.P. construction, as others have developed hybrid ocean racers and sophisticated power boats.

Hence the conception of the Fisher.

By far the most important factor was the necessity to perfect a hull whose lines would achieve the ability to perform in all weather conditions under sail or power and especially both. The marine architect, Gordon Wyatt, was responsible for initiating the development of these lines from the Baltic Fisherman, a motor fishing vessel which enjoys a reputation amongst professional seamen for seaworthiness and the ability to work in extreme weather.

The characteristics of this traditional shape were refined to give an easy entry to soften pounding and help sailing ability; a generous beam to promote buoyancy; a 'Canoe' stern to minimize any broaching tendency; a 50% ballast ratio to create stiffness; and a long keel to ensure steady directional control which helps to balance the easily handled but powerful ketch rig.


Having resolved the hull shape, no less effort was given to the superstructure design. This incorporates wide side decks protected by high bulwarks, a safe working foredeck, deep self draining cockpit, and, of course, the characteristic trawler shaped wheelhouse with its built in warmth and comfort that enables the owner to sail throughout the year.

While outward appearances are of rugged dependability, the accommodation has been given the soft touch. Although every inch of available space has been utilised to the maximum, the combination of a selection of carefully chosen fabrics and the natural warmth of teak induce a below decks atmosphere of discreet elegance. Ease of living is further helped by a carefully designed, well equipped galley together with top quality marine fittings for cabin heating, lighting and ventilation.

So an idea has become a reality. By 1977 over 800 Fishers have been launched around the world through a network of distributors in 18 countries, and are being produced at the rate of between three and five boats per week. Fairways Marine has become a thriving business with full order books and employs over 250 skilled workers in three different factories. Managed by a team of people dedicated to efficiency, quality control and service to the customer, these objectives have never changed throughout the years of steady expansion, nor will they do so in the future.

Meanwhile Fisher development continues.

Although they are already very acceptable products, we are continuously striving for improvement and perfection. By attending to the very smallest details as well as researching, for example, new methods of variable pitch power transmission, and computer designed sails, we feel we really can provide the cruising yachtsman with THE BEST OF ALL WORLDS.





The Catfisher 28 retains all the traditional characteristics, quality of finish and the aesthetic appeal of the Fisher mono-hull vessels, but is of course a Catamaran. It is indeed a truly amazing vessel in as much as the accommodation provides no less than two double cabins, one single cabin, a large comfortable deck saloon with inside steering and controls; a well equipped galley; and a large shower and toilet area. Externally there is an additional steering position availability in the cockpit, but the other enjoyable feature is the enormous amount of deck space for sunbathing, lounging, etc. afforded by the additional beam of a multi-hull.

The craft is available as a sloop rig for high performance

The craft is available as a sloop rig for high performance windward sailing, alternatively a ketch rig for the more cruising conscious, and another essentially unique feature is the twin screw manoeuvrability provided by the hydraulic drive system from the single diesel engine propulsion unit. Manoeuvring under power therefore is as simple as a twin screw motor boat, the vessel can in fact revolve on its own axis.

The twin hull underbody shape features a substantial length of straight keel, enabling the craft to take the ground horizontally with complete protection for the twin

propellers and rudders.

All in all a very versatile and useful vessel that has a well proven track record in very severe conditions, yet is capable of a very spritely and exciting sailing performance on an even keel with all of the advantages inherent in multi hull design. It is planned to introduce larger versions of this craft into the range at a later date.


The Fisher 30 is the forerunner and most popular version in our range. Over two hundred have been sold around the world, from Vancouver in the West to Tokyo Bay in the East.

After several years of continuous development, she is probably the optimum model for the average family yachtsman, who needs safety, seaworthiness, ease of handling, and a stimulating sailing performance.


The Northeaster inherits all the basic design features of the Fisher class, and has capably proved her seagoing performance to be identical in every respect. There is one basic and additional feature - more accommodation.

The beam amidships has been increased which together with a two berth aft stateroom and wheelhouse deck saloon affords an air of spaciousness in the accommodation below-deck seldom found on vessels of this size.

The Trawler 38

The Trawler 38 is the first of a new line of "little ships" from Fairways. It is completely unique in the fact that it is capable of doing 20 knots and 1000 miles nautical mile range (with optional engine and tankage). Very few other Trawler Yachts in the world can achieve that sort of performance, and none are capable of withstanding heavy weather and arduous conditions at full displacement speeds as comfortably as ours can. The reason: simple, many years of research and development by our design associates, experienced in the design and development of commercial fishing craft, have provided us with the prime ingredients for this comfortable, safe off-shore cruising power boat.

The accommodation is not only furnished to our usual exceptionally high standard of quality finish, but provides the owner with a luxuriously spacious double stateroom forward; double berth cabin (with slide out triple berth opion for children); a very spacious toilet and wash basin area, with separate shower stall (two toilets that shower available as an option); a comfortable and well thought out main saloon with dining area dinette with deck level galley, partially divided from the saloon by a breakfast bar counter.


The big ship style bridge houses the steering and engine controls, electronic navigational instrument facilities, chart stowage and chart table area with a comfortable seating facility for the helmsman and passenger.

Externally, the foredeck and sidedecks are well protected by a deep bulwark, and the afterdeck is large enough for owners and guests to sit or dine outside Mediterranean style. Up top the enormous sundeck over 12 feet square provides lavish sunbathing area for the warmer climates and an additional steering and engine control station can be supplied (as an option) installed in the dummy funnel. Like all Fairways craft, the Trawler retains that indefinable air of character and charm that other craft


